

On Wednesday, November 11, 2020, the Merrick Post No. 1282, American Legion, hosted the Veterans Day Ceremony at the Merricks Veteran Memorial Park. Past Post Commander and Post Chaplain James O'Neill was the master of ceremonies at this event. As Post Chaplain, he also read prayers at the Invocation and Benediction at this event. Post member Eugene St. John recited the Pledge of Allegiance at this event. Speakers at this event included Present Post Commander Robert Dishman and American Legion Auxiliary Unit 1282 President Laura Lahood. Post Judge Advocate Kenneth Braun introduced the "ringing of the bell ritual", in which a bell was rung 11 times signifying the end of major hostilities of World War I on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918. Performing the ringing of the bell at this ceremony was Post member Eugene St. John with the assistance of Sergeant at Arms Joseph Ambrosino. After the bell was rung 11 times, TAPS were played via a cd player.

Political officials who were present and spoke at this event were New York State Senator John E. Brooks (8th Senate District), Nassau County Legislator Steven D. Rhoads (19th District), Nassau County Legislator Thomas McKevitt (13th District), Town of Hempstead Supervisor Donald X. Calvin, Jr. and Town of Hempstead Councilman Christopher Carini (5th District). The sound system equipment and microphones for this event were provided by Post Service Officer John Weber and the music via a compact disc was provided by Post volunteer Richard Ambrosino. The audience consisted of members from the American Legion Merrick Post No. 1282, American Legion Auxiliary members from Merrick Unit #1282, members from the Jewish War Veterans (Ensign L. Soloway Post #652), members from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (Freeport/Merrick VFW #1310) and the general public.
